Students' mathematics placement is assessed upon admission. Students who are placed in MAT 050 Basic Math are required to complete Basic Math. Placements into MAT 100 or above indicate correct math entry level if desired as an elective.

All graduates are expected to complete all graduation requirements, including those noted above and: a minimum of 30 semester hours at Bluffton; a minimum of 24 of the last 30 completed at Bluffton; a GPA of at least 2.0 overall and within the major; participation in institutional assessment activities, satisfactory achievement in the departmental senior comprehensive examination, and participation in the baccalaureate and commencement services.

Program requirements are subject to change, though in no case will requirements be increased for students once they are admitted.
