Note that there are two separate cycles of 4<sup>th</sup> semester course rotations in the Graphic Design major program. Incoming students should begin pursuing both of these rotations in the Spring of the first year. An offering from cycle 1 and cycle 2 are generally offered in the same semester. However, the year in which the student begins fulfillment of these cycled courses will dictate the order in which they are continued in following years. Students can begin the order of the cycled course rotations based on the first eligible offering available.
