\* In general, this means choosing classes from three different prefixes. To qualify for a PCS minor, students cannot count more than six semester hours from other major or minor courses of study, or from their General Education requirements.

\*\*With appropriate theme; in the case of NCS 107, a General Education course, the student will need to do a major project related to peace and conflict studies.

This minor fits especially well with those who have participated in a semester-long cross-cultural term in Northern Ireland or in Washington, DC, though such participation is not required for the minor. In conjunction with the Northern Ireland or Washington Community Scholars' Center programs, students may obtain the PCS minor by completing the three required courses.

Students considering a PCS minor should take CRJ 180 Law, Justice, and Society for their Social Science Group B general education requirement.
