### **English Transfer Pathway**

## for Ohio Community College students transferring to Bluffton University



**November 2022** 

This document outlines the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway (OGTP) in English that has been designed to provide clarity and consistency for college courses transferring between Ohio 2-year and 4-year public institutions.

This same transfer pathway in English is now approved for students transferring to Bluffton University, through a partnership between 11 Ohio community colleges and 14 private colleges called the Ohio Consortium for Transfer Pathways to the Liberal Arts, and whose faculty and administration have collaborated to expand access and credit clarity for students transferring with an associate's degree from an Ohio community college to an Ohio private college or university.

Pages 1 & 2 of this document outline **community college courses that are approved statewide** for transfer credit toward the bachelor of arts degree in English at an approved 4-year institution. Pages 3-5 show how these courses transfer to Bluffton University to meet bachelor degree requirements.

#### **SPECIAL NOTES**

Some bachelor-degree granting programs may be competitive and admission into the program is not guaranteed.

Students should check with individual institutions for their program admission requirements.

Some bachelor-degree granting institutions require additional general education courses outside of the Ohio Transfer 36 and students may be required to take these courses in their junior or senior year. Students will still be able to follow this pathway and complete their bachelor's degree in approximately 60 additional credit hours.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> A minimum of two semesters of foreign language should be taken if available. Additional foreign language courses may be needed as well – check with your receiving institution. If more foreign language courses are taken, then the number of elective hours will be lower.

# How English Pathway Courses Transfer to Bluffton University



The following table outlines how transfer credits from the English transfer pathway and associate's degree will be applied to the bachelor's degree in English at Bluffton University.

Students interested in transferring to Bluffton University should meet with an admission counselor regarding optimal course selection at the community college and admission requirements. Bluffton requires courses in History and a Fine Art (Art, Music, or Theater) as part of its general education requirements, so it is recommended that students use the OT36 Arts and Humanities electives in this area. Additionally, Bluffton University requires 3 credits of Oral Communication (i.e. Public Speaking) and 2 hours of Wellness which could be taken as elective credits in the associate degree program. Bluffton University only requires *one* natural science course, which must have a lab component, and only *one* Social and Behavioral course.

#### **Advising Notes:**

A total of 124 hours minimum is required for graduation. For students completing only two years at Bluffton, this includes one hour of credit for attending 30 Arts & Lecture events. To complete the BA with two years at Bluffton, students need to transfer in 60 semester hours of credit. Students matriculating with fewer hours may take additional hours at Bluffton to complete the 124 hours required for graduation. A minor is not required. A statistics course is recommended but not required. Students may enroll in up to 17 hours per semester. Enrolling in over 17 hours in one semester requires special permission plus an overload fee.

**Bluffton Enduring Values** courses (BENV) prepare students to succeed in local and international contexts. At Bluffton University, the cross-cultural experience is a pivotal element of the general education curriculum, which strives to place each student in an ever-expanding context from individual identity to global citizen. Through personal interactions in diverse settings within and outside of the United States, from Appalachian Kentucky to Guatemala to the Czech Republic, students are challenged to examine what it means to be a responsible citizen in the global community and to develop an ethic of justice, service, and peacemaking.
