# **Psychology Transfer Pathway (AA to BA)**

# for Ohio Community College students transferring to Bluffton University



November 2022

This document outlines the <u>Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway (OGTP) in Psychology</u> that has been designed to provide clarity and consistency for college courses transferring between Ohio 2-year and 4-year public institutions.

This same transfer pathway in Psychology is now approved for students transferring to Bluffton University, through a partnership between 11 Ohio community colleges and 14 private colleges called the <u>Ohio Consortium for Transfer Pathways to the Liberal</u> <u>Arts</u>, and whose faculty and administration have collaborated to expand access and credit clarity for students transferring with an associate's degree from an Ohio community college to an Ohio private college or university.

Pages 1 & 2 of this document outline **community college courses that are approved statewide** for transfer credit for the AA tp BA degree in psychology at an approved 4-year institution. Pages 3-4 show the AS to BS degree. Pages 5-7 show how these courses transfer to Bluffton University to meet bachelor degree requirements.

#### Advising Notes:

Bluffton University requires courses in History and a Fine Art (Art, Music, or Theater) as part of its general education requirements, so it is recommended that students use the Arts and Humanities electives in this area. Additionally, Bluffton University requires 3 credits of Oral Communication (i.e. Public Speaking) and 2 hours of Wellness. (It is recommended that students use additional electives to complete these.) Bluffton University only requires *one* natural science course, which must have a lab component, and only *one* Social and Behavioral course.

This Transfer Pathway completes the Associate of Arts degree, which must total at least 60 semester credits and includes 36 credits of the Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36), which are approved general education requirements. ## Advising Notes:

A total of 124 hours minimum is required for graduation. For students completing only two years at Bluffton, this includes one hour of credit for attending 30 Arts & Lecture events. To complete the BA with two years at Bluffton, students need to transfer in 60 semester hours of credit. Students matriculating with fewer hours may take additional hours at Bluffton to complete the 124 hours required for graduation. A minor is not required. A statistics course is recommended but not required. Students may enroll in up to 17 hours per semester. Enrolling in over 17 hours in one semester requires special permission plus an overload fee.

**Bluffton Enduring Values** courses (BENV) prepare students to succeed in local and international contexts. At Bluffton University, the cross-cultural experience is a pivotal element of the general education curriculum, which strives to place each student in an ever-expanding context from individual identity to global citizen. Through personal interactions in diverse settings within and outside of the United States, from Appalachian Kentucky to Guatemala to the Czech Republic, students are challenged to examine what it means to be a responsible citizen in the global community and to develop an ethic of justice, service, and peacemaking.
