Boldface print denotes major course requirements. A statistics class and BIO335 Cell Biology (offered every fall) are also highly recommended. Completion of an additional major in chemistry or biology is recommended.

Total hours needed to complete graduation requirements are 124. (This includes 2 hours of Arts and Lecture credit.)

Note: The Scientific Inquiry and Critical Analysis competencies are met by the major. In general, competencies may be taken in any order. The exceptions are that Writing Well should be taken in the first year and Reading the Bible must be completed prior to taking the Religious Understanding competency. The timing of the remaining competencies is flexible and may be adjusted to accommodate desired elective courses.

Introduction to Psychology is often a prerequisite course required for further study in the medical field and should be taken for the Understanding Self and Society competency. A course in sociology is also recommended.
